Cheshire's fibre broadband boost for 40,000 additional premises

Connecting Cheshire has now reached the half-way point in its roll-out – with more than 40,000 additional homes and businesses now able to upgrade to fibre broadband.

BT Openreach engineers have installed more than 200 new roadside cabinets and laid around 400 kilometres of fibre optic cable to date, often in challenging conditions underground in both urban and remote rural areas.

Councillor David Brown, Deputy Leader of Cheshire East Council, on behalf of the Partnership said: "We are well on our way to reaching 96 per cent of premises and bringing a much-needed advantage to the county – both for businesses and home users. I urge everyone to check their availability and upgrade to faster broadband, to shop around for the best deal and take advantage of the real benefits." Read more
