Fancy Women's Bike Ride 2023

A big thank you to Campaign member Sue Booth for organising this year's "Fancy Women's Bike Ride" which was part of a worldwide event to show that women can claim space to ride on the streets enjoyably and dressed in ordinary clothes!

26 women of various ages assembled on Exchange Square, outside the new Chester Market, on Sunday 17th September then rode a circular route using streets and offroad paths around the city, pausing at places of interest and finishing at the Groves beside the River Dee.

At the end of the ride at the Groves the riders enjoyed ice cream from Snugbury's Ice Creams courtesy of Cycling UK's 'Big Bike Revival' initiative which was arranged locally by Campaign member Ian Slater.

The first Fancy Women Bike Ride was held in 2013 in Izmir, Turkey, to draw attention to World Car Free Day and to instill "the smell of perfume in cities instead of the smell of exhaust" It has taken off world-wide and we hope it will become an annual event in Chester.

Sustainable Cheshire Festival 2023



The Campaign had a stall at the Sustainable Cheshire Festival held in Grosvenor Park on Saturday 23rd September, organised by Cheshire Eco Communities.

It was a busy day with several Campaign members answering questions about cycling in Chester. Display materials illustrated cycle routes around Chester, different types of cycles and the many ways you can carry your stuff when cycling. Many members of the public stopped and enquired.

Campaign Donates to CycleStreets

At a recent Cycle Campaign meeting we agreed to make a donation to the CycleStreets organisation. This was considered a very beneficial use of a small portion of accumulated funds.



CycleStreets is a UK-wide, free to use, online cycle journey planner. It is designed by cyclists, for cyclists, and caters for the needs of both confident and less confident cyclists.


The Online Cycle Route Planner on the Campaign website uses CycleStreets. It is a web-based, open source resource which provides an easily accessible way to plan a cycle route in the Chester area. It presents 3 route options: the fastest, the quietest, or a "balanced" route. There is also a CycleStreets app for iphone and Android.

Originally, CycleStreets focused exclusively on the Cambridge area, but when approached, they kindly allowed our Campaign to access the resource so that the Chester area could benefit from their initiative. CycleStreets was created by Simon Nuttall and Martin Lucas-Smith. Both are regular bicycle users, based in Cambridge, and have been involved with Cambridge Cycling Campaign for many years. CycleStreets is run as a not-for-profit organisation.

Because it is open source, people in Chester can continue refining the details of routes in our area.



Protecting Off-road Route to Chester Station



People who are familiar with the rear entrance to Chester Station will know that, at the moment, there is an off-road route, shown in red on the map above, which runs from Westminster Road/Station View, via Charterhall Drive and through the now derelict Lloyds Banking Services site. It comes out at the ramped rear access to the station situated to the east of platform I, just next to the 2-tier cycle racks.


Campaign members have had growing concerns for quite a while that this direct and fast route from the eastern side of Chester may be blocked off if it is not stipulated to remain when the site is redeveloped.

Development work started recently, so Campaign members contacted the relevant Councillors and Council Officers and conducted on-site visits. They have since had an assurance from one developer who is starting work that a shared route use route round their working area would be protected.

At this stage it is not clear whether there is an overall development plan for the site which might specify a protected route, so it seems we need to keep a keen eye as work begins on further areas of the site.

Large Scale Laminated Maps Now Available for Campaign

Craig Steeland from the Campaign has been hard at work producing some large scale laminated maps of the Chester area which can be utilised whenever the Campaign is attending an event, or meeting with local organisations. Maps of this quality have not been available before.



Produced in A1 and A0 size, the maps show a lot of detail with great clarity and include the various signed cycle routes in the City and nearby. They will be especially useful to identify areas where problems exist and cycle access could be improved.

A big thank you to Craig, for his detailed work in producing the images from Open Source mapping,

then translating them into a readily printable format.

These maps have been added to the growing stock of resources available to the Campaign to promote cycling in Chester and beyond.

Cycle Maintenance at Storyhouse

Campaign member lan Slater, who is also a Storyhouse volunteer, organised a special introductory cycle maintenance session on 24th September for the benefit of other Storyhouse staff and volunteers.



6 Storyhouse volunteers took advantage of the session which covered basic issues such as safety checks and mending punctures.

Knowing these basic skills gives you more confidence when cycling.
