The Campaign has just launched Chester Cycle Buddies, a scheme to match experienced volunteer cyclists who are Campaign members (Helper Buddies) with those who would like some support to help them cycle more in Chester (Cycle Buddies).

Helper Buddies can help their Cycle Buddy with planning cyclefriendly routes to places they would like to go, ride with them to test out the routes and answer any queries.

Advice has been taken from various organisations including Cycling UK and especially the London Cycling Campaign who operate a successful scheme which has already helped many people.

A summer of Women's Cycle Maintenance Classes

This summer, the Campaign has run monthly introductory cycle maintenance classes specifically for women, which have been a huge success. Each session had spaces for 20 participants and all were fully booked, showing that there is a huge demand amongst women riders to learn about maintaining their bikes.

The 2-hour classes were free of charge and open to non-members as well as members of the Campaign. The classes were run at Bren Bikes, a cycle workshop set up by the Bren Project, a local charity which supports people with learning disabilities to reach their full potential.



Classes were run by the Bren Bikes' volunteers, who are also Campaign members, and overseen by Steve Fidler, Bren Bikes' workshop supervisor and a Cytech qualified mechanic.

Participants brought and worked on their own cycles.

Cycle and Pedestrian Path obstructed by road sign

The cycle and pedestrian shared path near the Tarvin roundabout was widened recently. Shortly afterwards, a contractor placed a road sign and bollards on it, completely obstructing the path. The purpose of the sign was to advertise a temporary road closure further up the night-times only, for 5 nights.

The obstruction was caught on camera by a Campaign member who lives locally.



Such obstruction of cycle and pedestrian routes should never happen, of course! The Campaign sees this as one of many ways in little thought is given to people travelling on foot or by cycle, and the free-flow of vehicles is given higher priority. It is - literally - an obstacle to active travel.

The Campaign member reported it and Councillor Karen Shore quickly responded. The contractors have been told not to do it again! Our view is that they should be trained not to do it in the first place.

If you see such obstacles, please do report them to the Council. A quick and easy way is to use the <u>Cheshire West and Chester app</u>, which has a "Report it" function. Campaign members use it to report problems on roads and paths, and the response from the Council is usually prompt.

Campaign Response to Proposals for Cycle Lanes on Ring Road

The Campaign was pleased to be asked by Cheshire West and Chester Council to comment on a proposal for creating advisory cycle lanes on the ring road, in both directions, between the new Northgate development and the Grosvenor Roundabout.

The proposal was for the existing 2-lane road to be re-painted in both directions with an advisory cycle lane (ie marked with a dashed white line) 1.5m wide, and a 20mph speed limit, between Hunter Street on St Martin's Way and Chester Magistrates Court on Nicholas Street.



The cycle lanes were proposed as part of the re-instatement of the ring road following the end of the "Clockwise" diversions during the Northgate Development building works.

The Campaign welcome any move to introduce more facilities for cycling in Chester. But facilities have to be of a standard which will make cyclists feel safe and encourage more people to cycle. Over the last year, the Government declared that cycling will play a far bigger part in our transport system and published a "Cycle Infrastructure Design" guide which encourages properly-protected bike lanes and cycle-safe junctions. Unfortunately, the proposed lanes were not up to that standard. So the dilemma for the Campaign was: do we support poor cycling infrastructure as "better than nothing" or not support it?

We had intense and lengthy discussions which also took up most of the August Campaign meeting. In the end, the decision was that the Campaign could not support the lanes as proposed. We would, however, very much welcome the introduction of a 20mph speed limit, which would improve safety for those few cyclists who use the ring road.

Having considered the views of the Campaign and other bodies, the Council's decision was that the lanes would not be implemented and consideration would be given to a 20mph speed limit.

Campaign Members Contributed to Highway Code Improvements

Campaign members responded to a Government consultation last year on amending the Highway Code to improve safety for vulnerable road users: pedestrians (particularly children), older adults and disabled people, cyclists and horse riders.

The amendments affecting cyclists are:

- Responsibility of road users: Introducing a
 "hierarchy of road users" which means that
 those who drive bigger vehicles have the greatest
 responsibility to reduce the danger or threat
 they may pose to other road users.
- Cyclist and pedestrian priority at junctions without traffic lights: Drivers and riders should give way to pedestrians crossing or waiting to cross the road.
- Overtaking passing distances and speeds:
 Guidance on safe passing distances and speeds
 when overtaking cyclists or horse riders, and
 ensuring cyclists and horse riders have priority at
 junctions when they are travelling straight ahead
 and a vehicle intends to turn left.
- Opening vehicle doors: Introduction of the "Dutch Reach" (when getting out of a vehicle, open the door using your opposite hand so that you naturally turn your shoulders and head, making it easy to look out for passing cyclists).


The consultation ran for 12 weeks (July to October 2020) and received nearly 21,000 responses, of which 16,500 were via Cycling UK (many Campaign members are also members of Cycling UK and the Campaign is affiliated to Cycling UK, which means that Campaign members can get reduced price

membership!). There was overwhelming support for all the proposed amendments.

The proposed amendments are not yet confirmed, but are expected to be fully implemented after they go before Parliament in the autumn. Read the response to the consultation here.

The Department for Transport says that since last year, cycling in England has risen by 46% – the greatest increase in post-war history and more in this one single year than over the whole of the previous 20 years! So it is even more important for all road users to share the road.
